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Teacher Led: Context notes

Atmosphere:

• An atmosphere is a surrounding environment or influence.

Mood:

• This is the feeling or atmosphere that is created by, and emerges through, the dramatic action.

Symbols:

 Symbols are what the drama makes you understand - they sum up the meaning of the play, sometimes even on a subconscious level. 10 min

(E.g. scary)


Super Challenge:

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Student Led: Creating the 'Mood' Activity

- Step One: Listen to the music.
- Step Two: Walk as if your emotions matched the music.
- Step three: greet people as if your emotion matched the music.
- Step Four: Say the line "Watch out behind you!"

How can you exaggerate or intensify the mood so that we fully believe we are in the atmosphere?


